































"When Steve first presented me with the original script for an unpublished 'Star Tigers' strip dating from 1980, I just knew it had to become a bonus feature on the second 'Star Tigers' disc. I had the idea of a moving comic strip, but I also knew that the very best way to appreciate the story would be as originally intended - on the printed page.
